

B.U.I.L.D. MEETING
Minutes – May 2, 2006

Paul M. moved, John P. seconded to approve the minutes of the April 4, 2006 meeting. Motion carried.

All members participated in a "How's Business?" discussion.

John P. gave the Treasurer's Report: \$4,832.49. He has two bills to pay, banners; \$2,621.38 and funeral flowers for Loyd Braack; \$26.63.

Old Business: Terri reported that she talked to Michelle and Ernie from Uncle Ernie's BBQ and they thought either of the last two weekends in September would work for a fundraising BBQ in Louisville. B.U.I.L.D. wouldn't have to do much except help where necessary.

Rod Little was not in attendance to talk about the "slush fund" and Terri said he didn't have any new information anyway. He felt the reception of the idea was not favorable but will do a little more research. Some members felt it was easier to give to specific events so the matter was put on hold for the time being.

The B.U.I.L.D. float was discussed and work will begin on it May 15 at 7:00 p.m. at Jim Group's building by the elevator. Todd Workman will be helping to load the rock wall on the trailer and it only needs to be decorated. Terri asked for a volunteer to ride on the float with her and Mitch Wendlandt.

Committee Reports:

Events: Dee reported for the events committee. She passed around a sign up sheet for help during the parade line-up and parade entry form applications. Nancy Kratky reported that she found an inflatable moon walk for \$150-\$175 to give the kids something to do during the off hours of Louisville Daz since there will not be a carnival. Paul moved, John P. seconded to approve the rental of the inflatable attraction. Motion carried.

Bob Copple also brought up the idea of a duck drop. Springfield does this and is very successful. The concern was the slow movement of the creek and Jason Rohrs suggested using the hills of Louisville and doing a ball drop. A brain storming session ended with a subcommittee appointed to try different kind of balls to see what works best. This idea will be pursued for Louisville Daz as a fundraiser for B.U.I.L.D.

Jeanne Anderson presented a draft of a flyer regarding the doggie contest and parade at Louisville Daz.

Economic Development: John P. reported that his committee continues to meet every other week and their emphasis is on an industrial park, the Louisville by-pass and the Plattsmouth Bridge. John Winkler was at their last meeting and was very helpful.

Presentation: Holiday lights were discussed and Terri found a business that does lighting and she will get a bid on maintenance. The agreed consensus was that they need to be fixed and maintained for not have them at all.

Marketing: Lexie reported that the maps are in the process of being revised and all the spots are filled. She was asked to get prices for radio stations to come out for the Last Hot Sunday in July and found out that that kind of thing is out of our price range. A DJ was discussed and thought he could be sponsored by businesses to mention their name.

Paul moved, John seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
