

# NOTICE OF PRIMARY ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th day of May 2008, at the listed polling places in the precincts of Cass County, Nebraska, an election will be held. The polls will open at 8:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Said election will be for nominating, or in some cases, electing candidates to various offices. Local issues will also be voted upon; there will be one Constitutional Amendment whose ballot title and text will be published by the Secretary of State.

As there were no more candidates filed in any of the voting precincts than are to be elected for Delegates to the County Convention, each candidate is automatically elected; therefore, they will not appear on the Primary Election Ballot.

**CASS COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT 13-0022,  
A/K/A WEEPING WATER PUBLIC SCHOOLS,  
IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA**

Shall Cass County School District 13-022, a/k/a/Weeping Water Public schools, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 77-3442, and 77-3444, be allowed to levy a property tax not to exceed fifteen (15) cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation in excess of the limits and exemptions prescribed by law for the 2008-2009 fiscal year, and fifteen (15) cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation in excess of the limits and exemptions prescribed by law for the 2009-2010 fiscal year for general operations, building or capital construction, remodeling, repair, site acquisition or any other lawful purpose as allowed by law, such excess levy to be in addition to any tax levies or exemptions to the levy limits which are or may be allowed by law?

**CITY OF LOUISVILLE SHALL THE CITY CHANGE THE ALLOCATION OF THE PROCEEDS FROM THE LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS**

**Summary of the Interrelationship Between Propositions 1 and 2**

If Proposition 1 **IS** approved, and Proposition 2 is **NOT** approved, the current sales and use tax will remain the same and the revenues will be reallocated as follows:

- .50 for streets
- .25 for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan
- .25 for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

If Propositions 1 and 2 **BOTH ARE** approved, the total sales and use tax will increase to 1.5% and the revenues will be allocated as follows:

- .50 for streets
- .25 for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan
- .75 for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

If Proposition 1 is **NOT** approved, but Proposition 2 **IS** approved, the total sales and use tax will increase to 1.5% and the revenues will be allocated as follows:

- .50 for streets
- .50 for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan
- .50 for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

If Proposition 1 and Proposition 2 **BOTH ARE NOT** approved, then the sales and use tax will remain at 1% with .50 used for streets and .50 used for economic development.

**VOTE ON BOTH PROPOSITIONS**

**PROPOSITION 1:**

Shall the City of Louisville reallocate the purposes for which the sales and use tax of 1% may be used as follows: 50% for streets, 25% for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan, and 25% for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

A vote FOR will result in reallocating the purposes for which the sales and use tax of 1% may be used as follows: 50% for streets, 25% for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan, and 25% for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

A vote AGAINST will result in the purposes for which the sales and use tax of 1% may be used remaining 50% for streets and 50% for economic development pursuant to the previously approved plan.

**PROPOSITION 2:**

Shall the City of Louisville increase the sales and use tax of 1% by .5% for a total sales and use tax of 1.5%, with the additional .5% being used for the reduction of debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

A vote FOR will result in an increase in the total sales tax to 1.5% with the additional .5% being used to reduce debt for the water well fields and water treatment plant.

A vote AGAINST will result in the sales and use tax remaining at 1%.
